RAD COHORT INSIGHTS REPORT

The Research Activate Deepen (RAD) Cohort is Youth Climate Lab's second iteration of the award-winning program that supports youth to lead the collective effort towards a more equitable, just, and climate-resilient future. The RAD Cohort equips youth (18-30) with skills, mentorship, and funding to design and implement community projects that foster meaningful engagement, collaboration and intersectional action to advance the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Centring SDG 13, Climate Action, and SDG 17, Partnerships for the Goals, the RAD Cohort fosters a community of solidarity rooted in principles of radical collaboration, climate justice, arts-based methodologies, and intersectionality.

WHAT WE DID TOGETHER

The RAD Cohort's seven-month learning journey included learning modules on topics such as the 2030 Agenda, climate justice, community-led solutions development, multi-solving, and project development.

PEER-TO-PEER CIRCLES

Participants were also invited to reflect and test out their learnings from the modules through peer-to-peer circles. These spaces were designed to strengthen the cohort community, be introduced to tools to help cope with climate anxiety, arts-based methodologies for creative collective visioning, and bounce off ideas for their community projects

YOUTH PAID AS MENTORS

Each participant was also matched with a mentor with similar SDG or community interests to provide guidance, share insights, and support participants shape, design, and implement their community projects. Mentors are advocates, organizers, and leaders committed to supporting the growth and capacity-building of young people. They hold knowledge and experience in working with communities, practice equity-centered collaboration, and are excited to prompt insightful questions to encourage participants to think critically about their projects.

PARTNERSHIPS TO DESIGN AND DELIVER THE RAD COHORT PROGRAM

The program and curriculum were designed with support from the 4Rs Youth Movement. A partnership with The Starfish Canada was also sparked, to amplify participant voices through an opportunity to submit to The Starfish Journal. Community Foundations of Canada was also integral to the success of the program by providing mentorship for YCL staff, and helping to amplify the program across social media.



CREATION OF THE RADICAL COLLABORATION CARDS



A 20-card virtual card deck was developed to facilitate and aid groups in determining opportunities for radical collaboration. The prompts foster a type of collaboration that radically embodies equity, lived experiences, community, art, youth, and intersectionality to advance solutions-development in a way that is inclusive and systemic.

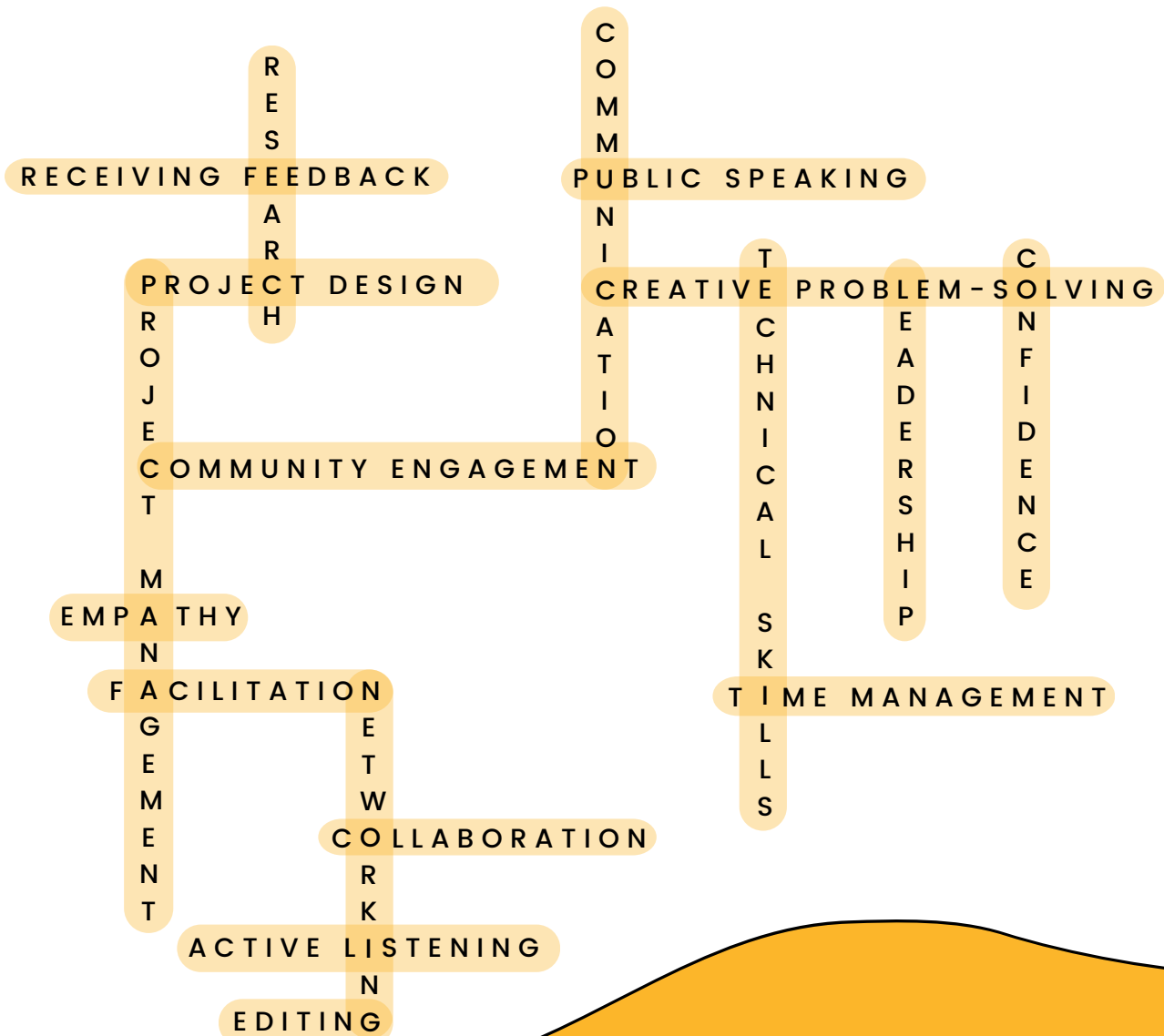

INSIGHTS & OUTCOMES

The skills participants said they developed and strengthened throughout RAD Cohort



- Participants noted that funding, mentorship, peer-to-peer support, training material modules, and flexibility were especially helpful to enable their success in designing and implementing projects.
- Many participants reported that despite their passions for various causes, they experienced barriers dedicating time, resources, and energy to unpaid opportunities.
- Participants reported that significant intentional time and funding are essential to allow for a successful delivery of a community project that engages community and centers the principles of the RAD Cohort program.
